Elder Arthur A. Harris was saved May 10, 1938 in a bean field outside of Salinas, CA. He was baptized May 18, 1938 by the Hebron Heights MBC of Salinas, CA. Elder Bill Dowell performed the baptism.

Elder Harris was called to the ministry Nov. 22, 1943 in Riverbank, CA at the Northern Dist. Association. He was ordained April 16, 1944 by the First MBC of Antioch, CA.

Elder Harris has done missionary work in San Jose, CA in 1946, and MBC, Antioch, CA. He was involved in building programs, in Eastside, Stockton, CA in 1949, Friendship in 1949 to 1950, San Jose, CA in 1947, Eastside, Stockton, CA 1955 to 1956, and in Wenatchee Eastside in 1962.

## "A Prince and a great man Fallen this day ... "

In Loving Memory Arthur Alanzo Harris June 19, 1914 - November 16, 1989

To the right is a likeness of my brother-in-law, whom I called Art. Brother Art was saved in a bean field in Salinas, California, in 1938. He was baptized by the Hebron Heights Missionary Baptist Church in Salinas, California "Now called Tout & Garner M.B.C."

Bro. Art was ordained to the office of Deacon by the Antioch M.B.C. of Antioch, Ca., and then on Thanksgiving Day 1943 in an Associational meeting in Riverbank, Ca. He, Bro. Roy Reed, and Bro. Lester McCalister announced their call to the ministry.

It is so hard to write about a man who became a lecent in his own.

It is so hard to write about a man who became a legend in his own It is so hard to write about a man who became a legend in his own time. He was loved and respected by so many for the works sake and his stand for Jesus and His church. Yet, despised by some for the very same reasons. He started his life for the Lord in what is now known as "The Old work in California" and he went to Glory standing in the same work, and for the same principles. We fussed, argued, debated and grouched with one another. Yet, we were brothers and when Principles were at stake, we brothers-in-law stood together. My heart is empty, His seat is empty and I shall have to stand without the support that I had grown accustomed to for 43 years. for 43 years.

ro. Art conducted several Revival meetings where I was pastor and I conducted some for him. Yet I never met a man who loved the Lord, His Cause and Lost Sinners more than Eld. Arthur A. Harris. He would walk the aisles, with tears streaming down his face, literally begging lost people to come to Christ before it was forever to late. At the same time I have seen him get such a vision of the Crucified One whom he was preaching about and the death He died that in the midst of his preaching he would shout and sinners would cry out. We

Baptist shall miss such a man. They don't grow on trees! While in Salinas, Bro. Harris met and married Sis. Irene Cooper, my wife's older sister and the daughter of Missionary Eld. John Cooper and wife Effie. Through the years these two have grown and stood together. I was priviledged to attend their Golden Anniversary in 1988. During their years together the Lord blessed them with five children. Sis. Connie Lawless, wife of Pastor Lane Lawless in Tracy, Ca.; Eld. DeWayne Harris, Pastor of the Alisal Baptist Church in Salinas, Ca.; Esther Blackwell, wife of Tom Blackwell, Song Leader for Landmark church in Salinas, Ca.; Cynthis Browning, wife of Vernon Browning of Tracy M.B.C.; and Paula Sumner.

Bro. Harris' first pastorate was Assistant to Eld. R.Y. Blalock in Concord, Ca. Then in 1945 he accepted the call as the first pastor of the Brentwood, M.B.C. While pastor he was drafted into the U.S. Army and served from February 7, 1945 to June 4, 1946, rising to the rank of Corporal.

Upon being released from the Army, Bro. Harris went on the mission field and organized the First Missionary Baptist Church in San Jose, Ca. in September 1946 and served as pastor to May 1948. He accepted the call of the Eastside M.B.C. in Stockton in May of 1948 and served until called by Friendship M.B.C. of Sacramento, December 1949, and served that church until accepting a call from the La Habra church in November 1950 and served there until February 1954.

Eastside of Stockton called him back as pastor in April 1954 and he served them until being called by Brewster, Wash., in October 1956 and served there until August 1958. He was called by the Eastside M.B.C. of Wenatchee, Wash., September 6, 1959 and served there until June 9, 1968.

until June 9, 1968.
While serving in Washington he was instrumental in organizing the Washington State Association. He left Wenatchee because the Winton M.B.C. in California called him as pastor in June 1968 and he served there and taught in Airport M.B.C. School much of that time until he was called by Salinas Landmark M.B.C. in November 1969 and served there until he resigned in July of 1978. He thought he had retired but Pedley M.B.C. called and he accepted in August 1980 and carried there until Quoust 1981 at which time the Alisal Baptist served there until August 1981 at which time the Alisal Baptist Church of Salinas called him as Assistant Pastor to his son, Bro. DeWayne and he was serving in that capacity when the Lord called him home. I suppose I knew this old Soldier of the Cross better than any other man alive, being related by marriage and the Blood of



Jesus. Having served as his moderator in many of his debates with the Church of Christ people and observing him as he debated Bro. Vernon Barr from Dallas, Texas. And published it in a book which Bro. Harris told me that "not one of Bro. Barr's brethren would buy". I would think that this would tell you who won in that contest. But, now that they both are over there, perhaps they can agree.

This work owes a debt of gratitude to that great man AND HE WAS GREAT! For had it not been that he and a few more had the Grace to stand against overwhelming odds in 1951 there very well would be no work like you enjoy now in California. So tonight as I sit at this typewriter and tears dim my eyes and I recall "precious" memories I thank God for A.A. Harris and the Grace that God gave him to stand. November 16, 1989, at about 8:00 a.m. our time the Captain of the

Lord's Host came silently down and waited for this Joshua to put his foot in the great swelling Jordan. By faith I see the waters pile up and Art's face as he saw Him waiting to lead into the promised land and to Victory He has promised to all His faithful.

Oh what a send off we gave this great warrior. Over 300 brethern crowded into Landmark church. His son did a superb job. God just kept giving grace on top of multiplied grace. His son-in-law Bro. Lawless did the obituary. His daughters sang, his grand-children sang. I prayed. Eld. Don Ross and I prayed. His casket was borne by eight of his younger preacher brethren. At the cemetery, America the Beautiful was rendered along with that sad sounding taps. Yes, his light is out here but by faith I see a bright star in the heavens tonight.



Bro. DeWayne did an outstanding job. God just gave more grace as we celebrated Art's promotion to heaven, and celebrate we did. No one there has ever seen anything like it. And everybody envied Bro. Art before it was over. As one said at the Cemetery, "If Bro. Harris could have been here, he would have approved." To which I say Amen and Omen again. and Amen again.

At the conclusion of the cemetery services Deacon Bill Harris of Oroville church led us in singing "Amazing Grace". We who were there will never hear nor sing it as good until THAT Day. In concluding this article, I thank God for Bro. Art and that I got to

know him and fellowship with him. I thank God for his dear wife Irene who has stood so faithfully by him through the years, drug from pillar to post, not enough of the right things to eat at times. Sleeping in lofts and on floors, yet through it all she bravely continued on. May God bless you Irene and continue to give the Grace you had in the services.

One post script, Bro. Harris was laid to rest November 1989, and on November 24, 1989, 46 years from the day Art announced his heavenly calling, Irene, the children, and most of the grandchildren were in El Nido for the 49th session of the Northern Missionary Baptist Association. I know my Brother, My Friend; He would have liked that! Until He calls, may you and I follow in the steps of faith-fulness. Your Brother, Richard A. Harless, I




In 1962 Elder Bratcher was called to the ministry while at the same place he was born again. He was ordained April 3, 1970 by the Landmark MBC of San Pablo.

BELOVED BROTHER, ELDER C.E. HUNT

Brother Hunt was born Charles Enoch Hunt to Samuel J. Hunt and Nancy Holder in Morganville, Kentucky, January 23, 1888, in the same house his father was born. He was the second son of a family of eight (five sisters and two brothers). He pastored churches until the age of 80, edited the Missionary Baptist Paper until the age of 76, taught Bible classes and was asked to fill the pulpit for various churches in the area until the age of 90.

He never turned down an invitation to preach. In 1907 when he was 19, he eloped with Maude Hancock who was 16 to Chandler, Oklahoma in his buggy. Charles and Maude were married 69 years. To this union four children were born, Verdie Lee, Nora Frances, Charles Alfred and George Enoch. In 1913, he went to work for the Southern Pacific Railroad as a car inspector in order to support his family, staying with that employment for 25 years, he put himself through high school, earned his Doctor of Divinity degree from the "Missionary Baptist Institute," Little Rock, Arkansas. When he was transferred to the small town of Mt. Shasta and organized the First Missionary Baptist Church there.

His memory of volumes of scripture enchanced his ministry, allowing him to quote entire passages. Sometimes a verse or two of an old Hymn was sung to emphasize a point in his sermon.

During the years that I have priviledged to be his pastor we spent many hours together. Many of them traveling up and down the state to various meetings. I learned to love and respect him as a man and for the principles he stood for. I was always encouraged during the preaching service by his presence and his amens. I knew that he understood what I was preaching about. I miss him today and his absence will be felt for a long time to come.

Brother Hunt's passing marks the end of an era. He out lived so far as I know, those of his generation who were his associates in the ministry. I am thinking of brethren like Eld. Claude Moore, Eld Tiz Griffith, Eld John Cooper, Eld Lee Dowdle, Eld R.Y. Blalock, and of course others whom I may not known about.

Brother Hunt's private life as well as his ministerial life was an example as to what God's ministers should be. He was a man of the highest integrity, his word was as good as his bond; his moral character was the epitome of personal moral purity. Brother Hunt had a great compassion for lost men and women with a desire to see them saved. His live the Lord's church was such that he made many sacrifices for the cause of the Lord during his lifetime. He loved to preach, and hear preaching about the church, the Bride of Christ, etc.

As to the office of the pastor, Brother Hunt lent dignity to it. His life was in harmony with the statement of the apostle Paul when he said, "I magnify mine office". He was always, at all times "the preacher". Yet he enjoyed talking about the common things of life. He had a great sense of humor. He like to laugh at something that was funny and enjoyed life.

Another outstanding attribute to Brother Hunt was his sweet and kind spirit. He was able to disagree with you and still love you and respect your privilege to disagree with him. He and I never had an argument over something that we did not totally agree on. During all the years that I knew him he never said an unkind word or treated me with disrespect.

Brother Hunt's ministry was a blessing to many, many people. Perhaps only eternity will reveal the great number of those whose lives he blessed. He loved to preach and was faithful to his "Calling" to the end. There can be no doubt in the mindy of any who knew him as to his call to the ministry. May God bless his memory and his life as an example of what a God-called minister should be. He has gone to join the ranks of other blood bought, redeemed children of God. Thank God the parting is not permanent. We shall one day be united again with those saints who have gone on before us.

#### THE CHURCH AND HER OFFICERS

The church is a called out. group of baptized believers. She may be a church and have no officers. Jesus set the first officers in the Chs. Luke 6:12, 13; 1 Cor. 12;128, when he ordained them as apostles. Acts 1:26 covers the election of a pastor. A pastor is an overseer. 1 Tim. 3:1; Titus 1:7; Acts 1:20; 20:28; Phil. 1:1; 1 Pet.2:25; 5:2; The word is OVERSEER.

N. T. DEACONS: Acts 6,1-4; Phil. 1:1; 1 Tim. 5:8; 12, 13. The word deacon means ministry in material things. ELDERS OR PREACHERS IN THE CHURCH: Acts 11:30; 14:23; 20:17; 1 Tim,5:17; Tit.1;5; Heb. 13:7; Jas.5:14; 1 Pet. 5:1, 2; 2 Jno;1; 3 Jn. 1

The first church had a treasurer. John 12 6; 13:29.

The first church had a clerk, Luke 1:1.

CHURCH DISCIPLINE; There are but three subjects of church discipline.

- 1. Differences between brethren, Matt 18:15-18. (1) try to settle it between themselves, (2) take a witness or two, (3) take it to the CH.
  - 2. Sins of abomination, 1 Cor.5:1-13; 6:1-3; 6:9, 10; Gal. 5:19-21; 2 Thes. 3:6.
- 3. Heresy: Rom.16:17; 1 Cor.11:19; Gal. 5:11; 6:12,13; Titus 3:10; 1 Jon. 2:18-22; 2 Jon. 7; 1 Tim.4:1; 2 Tim. 2:17, 18; 2 Pet. 2:1; 3:3-7; Jude 18; Matt.7:15; 24:24.

CHURCH A DEMOCRACY: (1) In receiving members, Acts 10:46-48; Ron 14:1; (2), In discipline: Neither preachers, pastors nor deacons discipline churches. Each church did her own disciplining. 1 Cor.5; 2 Cor. 2:5-7, 8. (3) Calling her own pastors: Acts 1:20-26, (4) Each church is sovereign in herself. Matt.20:25,26; 28:18,19,20. Is authorized by Jesus. Matt. 16:19; 18:18.

#### HOW THE EARLY CHURCH DID MISSION WORK

THE CHURCH ONLY SENT OUT MISSIONARIES during New Testament days. Acts 13:1-3; 2 Cor.8:19-23; Rev.1:20, Angel meant messenger, pastor of the church. Acts 14:27, No hint in the New Testament of a body over a local church. They had church councils about doctrinal matters Acts 15:2; Gal. 2:9, Rom. 16:16; 1 Cor. 16: 19; 2 Cor. 11: 6; Phil. 4:15, show salutations of various churches to others from whom Paul received help to carry on his mission endeavors. There is of an instance of anything like an association doing business for the churches.

#### HOW EARLY CHURCHES SUPPORTED THEMSELVES

1. By collections. 1 Cor. 16:1, 2. The word is "logiai" and means a stated sum. 2. By stewardship. Acts 5th, & 6th, Chs. 3. By faithfulness, Luke 16:9-12, 1 Cor. 9:7-14, 2 Cor,8:12,13,, every one had a responsibility, but none were to be burdened. 2 Cor. 9:13, shows the method, 4. by systematic giving, each first day of the week, 1 Cor.16:2, as the Lord prospered them.

#### BAPTIST BACK TO JOHN THE BAPTIST Eph. 3:21.

Matt 16:18, Eph. 3:21 and Rev. 12 teach us that the church Jesus built would stand till he returns for her, to go and be with him, John 14..1-5. John the Baptist baptized John the Beloved or Revelator whom Jesus set in the church, Matt.4:21, John the Beloved baptized Polycarp, Dec. 95 A. D. .See Neander's Church History, p. 285. Polycarp Organized the Partus church at the foot of the Tiber, A. D. 150. Cyrus' Commentary of Antiquity, p. 924. Tertullan, a preacher from Turan church organized Turan church, Bing Joy, Africa, A. D. 237. Armitage's Church History; p. 182. Tertullan, a preacher from Turan church, in Italy, organized the Pontifossi church, at the foot of the Alps in France, A. D. 398 Nowlin's Church History, Vol. 2, p. 318. Adromicus, a preacher from Pontifossi church organized Darethea church, A. D. 671, Lambert's Church History, p. 47. Archer, a preacher from Darethea church, organized Timto church A. D. 738, Mosheim's History, Vol. 2, p. 394, Balcolao, a preacher from Timto church Asia Minor, organized Lima Piedmont church: A. D. 812, Neander's Church History, V. 2, p. 329. Aaron Arlington, a preacher from Lima Piedmont church. organized. Hill--Cliff church, A. D. 937. Alex Munster's Israel of the Alps, p. 39. H. Roller, a preacher from Hillcliff Church, Wales, England, The Penepek Church of Pennsylvania came from Wales in a body in 1701. J. W. Jetter, a preacher from Philadelphia Association organized the Baptist church at Dyersburg, Tennessee,. Thus we have a direct line of succession of Baptist churches from Jesus to America, or from America back to the baptism which John brought from heaven. Matt.21:25.




