

- I. THE CHURCH UNDER THE LINISTRY OF CHRIST. (Personal miniatry)
- 1. The Church founded by Christ. Matt. 16:18; Eph. 3:21
- 2. The Church taught by Christ. Matt. 5:1-2.

Now read the three following chapters. They had at least three years of Biblical teaching. Even after Christ arose from the dead He continued to teach them until He left the world. Acts 1.3. But, regardless of the many THINGS, He taught them. John 16:12.

- II. THE CHURCH UNDER THE APOSTLES WHO WERE TAUGHT AND GUIDED PERSONALLY BY THE HOLY SPIRIT, AND WHO'S WORDS WERE CONFIRMED BY SPIRITUAL GIFTS.
- 1. The second phase of the church started at Pentecost. It had another Comforter and Teacher, the Holy Spirit.

When Art was just a boy his family moved to Ohio and at age 10 Bro. Art accepted Christ as Savior and was baptized by the Vine Street Baptist Church in Cincinnati, Ohio. This was just the beginning of his service in the Lord's work.

After surrendering to the call of the ministry in 1950 Bro. Art was married to Billie Fulgham on Nov. 22, 1951. Bro. Art was soon ordained by the Sunset Missionary Baptist Church of Dallas, Texas in June of 1952. Bro. and Sis. Richardson now have 5 children and 13 grandchildren.

NO. 3 LANDMARK BAPTIST CHURCH 609 Figueroa Landmark Baptist Church Robert Cullifer, Pastor This attractive Gothic Revival building was constructed in 1860 as Folsom's First Methodist Church. The local pastor and his flock of 38 sought a New England connection, with wood ornamentation shipped from Maine gracing the brick and granite cornerstones of the façade. A bible was sealed into a cornerstone when it was completed in 1860. Their first bell was installed in 1907 and pealed throughout the district for years to come. This building also served as Folsom's first public high school between 1922 and 1924. The church added a social hall in the rear in 1938, with new pews and an organ installed in 1958. For the last 44 years, the Landmark Baptist Congregation has made this church their home and welcomed the community for numerous charitable events over the decades. Tour the church and be sure to check out the historic photographs in the museum. We thank the church members for graciously opening their hallowed halls for the tour!
