### Paslay, Richard Lee—(ABA)

Brother Richard was born in Santa Monica, California, June 13 1933. He was saved in August of 1949, and baptized by the MBC in Concord, California, April 1962. He was ordained as a deacon and then surrendered to preach in 1966, and licensed by the church in Concord.

He moved to Bellflower and attended CMBI from 1966-71 receiving his Th.B.

I was born June 13 1933 in Venice California and lived there until my parents moved to Hayward Calif., in 1941. My Parents were not church goers. I moved to Denver City, TX to live with a cousin and in 1948. It was there in Texas that I trusted the Lord as my Savior, was dunked by an unscriptural church in 1949. I moved back to Hayward to live with my parents. In Dec. 1950(?)

I joined the US Air Force. I spent three years and was set free in 1953, and served in the reserves until 1958.

I married LaDean Chapman of Hayward, CA on September 3, 1955. We began attending the Concord church in 1962, where I was ordained a deacon six months later(?). I have three daughters, five grand children and three great grand children. My daughter Lisa married David Keeling who is pastor in Sunnyvale, CA.

My wife and I are going on 62 years of marriage.

### Baptist Sentinel-February 1985 Oakdale Finds Camp Site

Pastor Richard Pasley, of the first missionary Baptist Church of Oakdale, Ca., announces that their church has "found a camp that is for sale located in the central part of the state near the town of Madera and just out of Oakhurst with easy access to the camp off Highway 41. The camp has not been used for about 8 years. There is 100 acres of heavily forested land at the 5,000 ft. elevation. Three sides are National Forest,. it has numerous natural springs supplying all the water needed. There is no electricity, but the camp that was there had a big generator to supply their needs." Brother Paslay has stated that this generator has been destroyed, but that another brother has already donated a large generator that can supply all the power the camp will ever need, if decision is made to purchase the camp.

He continues: "There are two large buildings, one is a dining hall and kitchen with an upstairs that has ten sleeping rooms (about 4 to a room). There is a beautiful rock fireplace at one end of the dining hall. The eating area seats about 150, with an outside deck of 2,250 sq.ft. which can also be used as a dining area. The other building is a chapel with 3,195 ft.2 with a stage area and two rooms on each side. Upstairs there are two bedrooms. Both of these buildings are well built and in good condition except they need cleaning. There is a bathhouse containing 576 sq.ft., with eight showers and eight commodes (four on each side). There is a snacks-shack and a playground shack. Also there are 19 individual sleeping cabins containing 210 to 265 sq.ft. Some are in poor condition and need to be rebuilt. There is a large swimming pool that needs refinishing. There is room to expand the bathhouse and add other things as needed. "

The church is negotiating with the owner for what appears to be very attractive terms. They would like to know as soon as possible of any church that would be willing to participate if an agreement can be reached. The contract will be drawn up so as to safeguard the churches against loss of property in case of unforeseen events in the future. 

The Reverend Richard Pasley is the new minister at the First Missionary Baptist Church in Oakdale.



Brothers and sisters in Christ, messengers of the churches, visitors and guests. I want to thank you for giving me this privilege of being your moderator for this associational year. My prayer is that I may serve you in a way that win be pleasing to you as well as to the Lord. Please pray for me that I will perform these duties as they should be.

My subject for the Moderator's Address is "Standing in Out Place." In the book of Judges, chapter 7, verse 21, we read: "And they stood every man in his place round about the camp, and all the army ran, and cried, and fled."

What a tremendous motivating story from the pages of God's Word. Every one of Gideon's soldiers obeyed their orders. "Every man stood in his place ..."

We should notice that they did not rush into the host of Mideon as greedy either of blood or spoil but patiently stood to see the salvation of the Lord. They obediently held their lamps, blew their trumpets, broke their pitchers. Breaking into panic, the Mideonites, " ...Ran, and cried, and fled," they fell upon one another in flight. The victory was complete.

There are some great lessons that we can learn from this incident:

First, let's notice the "Unity" that was prevalent. There was no division, no quarrels, no mutinies among them. They stood united, just as they were ordered to stand.

What a great work that the churches of the Lord can do if they will work together in carrying out the orders that the Son of God has left with His church. To work together and be successful, takes unity. The Psalmist said, "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." (Psalm 133:1).

Secondly, notice that they had courage. Though so few in number they displayed no fear. In its conflict with the world today the church needs members with fiber, of courage. It seems as if our number is diminishing as some depart from the faith, and some fall by the wayside. We need to remember, "If God be for us, who can be against us?" God had Moses speak these words to Israel "Be strong and of a good courage, fear not, nor be afraid of them; for the lord thy God, He it is that doth go with thee: He will not fail thee, nor forsake thee." (Deuteronomy 31:6).

Another characteristic of these men was their faith. The victory was a victory of faith. We sing a song that goes like this, "Faith is the victory, oh glorious victory that overcomes the world." "Without faith it is impossible to please God." This kind of faith is trust. Trust in God for the victory. The Wee Hebrew children are a great example of true faith. Listen as they answered the King, "If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and He will deliver us out of thine hand, 0 King." (Daniel 3:17). Yes, God can and will deliver us from the evil one!

**Lastly**, notice the obedience that they displayed. "And they stood every man in his place."

As they were given their instructions, they heeded them right to the greatest degree. In so doing, it brought them victory. "And all the army ran, and cried, and fled." God told the children of Israel about their obedience: "Behold, I set before you this day a blessing and a curse; a blessing, if you obey the commandments of the Lord your God, which I command you this day: And a curse if you will not obey the commandments of the lord your God ..." We need to see the importance of obedience in our day if we are to gain the victory in our fives and in our churches.

With Unity, Courage, Faith and Obedience, how triumphant the success! The victory was complete. The men stood in order round the camp as commanded. At the given signal they blew their trumpets, and broke their pitchers, and held their torches high, and cried, "The sword of the Lord, and of Gideon." They stood and watched the enemy flee. It was a victory which was God-given and complete.

Consider an illustration from more recent history. On the field of Waterloo, there was a regiment which stood under fire through all that dreadful day, and were not permitted to charge against the foe. They held the key to their position, and as again and again they asked for permission to advance, the answer came back, "Stand firm." When they had nearly all fallen, the message came back for the last time from their commander, "You have saved the day," and the answer was returned, "You will find us all here." Sure enough, there lay a heap of stain on that fatal yet glorious, hill. They had simply stood, and history has given them the reward of valor and imperishable fame of having turned the tide of the greatest battle of the nineteenth century.

So, God is preparing crowns for those of His that will stand in their places. Our admonition for today can be found in what Paul wrote to the Corinthian church, "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit ye like men, be strong." Corinthians 16:13).


There is a great need in these last days of the soon coming of the Lord for His people to stand firm among the host of evil that is all around us. A need to stand firm for, "The doctrines once delivered to the saints," and to practice and be obedient to them. In the past years, we have witnessed many brethren fall by the wayside, not being able to stand for the great doctrines our Lord gave to His church.

The Lord, in His letters to the seven churches in Revelation, said that He knew their works and their tribulations, and He commended the church at Ephesus for their stand against false teachers and their ability to stand and not give up. To the church at Smyrna, He said that He was pleased for their stand in spite of the persecution and hardship they had experienced. The Pergamos church was commended for their standing and holding fast His name and not denying the faith. And the church at Philadelphia was commended for using the opportunities and open doors that were set before them.

May we be challenged by this example in our text, as well as the many places where the Scriptures speak, to hold fast and to stand in the last days.

### The Need For Truth

Text: John 17:6-17

Messengers, brethren, and friends of the California Cooperative Association, I want to thank you for allowing me to serve as your moderator one more year. I count it a great privilege to be able to act in this position for such a great group of people. My prayer is that God will receive all the honor and glory in our deliberations and that each one of you will pray for me that I may conduct this meeting with wisdom.

God made us for living. We are designed to function at various levels: physical (the body), mental and emotional (the soul) and religious (the spirit). The proper function of these levels constitutes life as God intended.

If the body is crippled or diseased, living is impaired and made difficult. If the soul is hampered, crushed or limited, living is seriously reduced.

If the spirit is deprived of its functioning essential (faith), our capacity to live becomes primitive and animal-like.

What is necessary to prevent this decent into meaninglessness, is that "man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God" (Matt. 4:4). Jesus addressed these words to Satan during the temptation in the wilderness. They clearly (do not) deny the need for bread (food), but they equally and clearly insist that something more is needed to live a full and happy life.

Without the knowledge of the Word of God and a resolve to follow it, nothing can prevent the twisting of our souls, the limiting of our mental powers, the upset of our emotional balance and the devastating impairment of our judgments. Even out bodies soon manifest the terrible effects of minds deprived of guidance and security of the divine Word.

Sometimes, with the best of intentions and often at great personal cost, men and women in many walks of life continue to practice activities that destroy human lives. They continue to make decisions that render their own existence drab or dangerous. Witness the traffic in drugs by those who want a thrill but who find themselves hooked in the process. Or pornography, which murderously exploits those involved, too often is supported by even well dressed business men

and women who openly buy and read porn magazines or rent X-rated videos for home viewing. Add the problem of abortion, easy divorce, homosexuality, racial bigotry, corporate and judicial corruption, tax evasion, the aids plague, the growing acceptance of euthanasia and the ultimate horror of nuclear holocaust.

We have lost the secret of living and nothing can restore it except the "glorious, illuminating, healing Word of God" "And the truth shall set you free" (John 8:32). "He sent forth His Word and healed them, and delivered them from destruction" (Psalm 107:20).

True life is made visible in God's children by the continual exhibition of the 'Fruit of the Spirit' (Gal. 5:22-23).

So often these attributes are missing from the members of the Lord's churches. Why? Is it because these teachings are not taught to the people? Or is it that God's people are not heeding the truths of God's Word? Pastors and teachers must expound with persistence and clarity the truths of God's Word.

Truth is the heart and soul of the Word of God. It is that 'Secret and hidden wisdom of God' (I Cor. 2:7) which Paul sets in sharp contrast with the wisdom of the world (I Cor. 1:20). The truth supplies the lost secrets of human behavior which are necessary if we are to live as God intended for us to live.

Since the truth is grounded in the crucifixion, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and in the presence of the Holy Spirit in the believer, an other truths flow from it. This truth exhorts us to the daily practice of our union with Christ and reminds us of the availability of His power and comfort at any moment. It should, therefore, be the chief subject in the curriculum of every church, and the central theme of all pulpit preaching.

What we find today is a frightening biblical illiteracy even though the Bible is our "Rule of Faith and Practice." We may hear many sermons, yet be taught little truth. We may drown in words, but thirst for reality. How many people in our churches know the meaning of terms like "Justification," "Sanctification," "The Kingdom of God," "The Bride of Christ," "Walking by Faith," "The fruits of the Spirit"?

The need of the hour is for us, as leaders of the churches, to become committed to the discipline of the people to We by the Word of God and to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit in their lives. Then we well see members growing to maturity, moral purity, personal integrity and loving. By this there will be a penetration into the communities in which we live.

This is God's plan to change the world through His Truths which He left with His church. He marks success in a church not by impressive buildings or massive numbers, but by people who are warm, loving, secure individuals, who, are able to reach out to others in need and to offer a model of healing to the ones who are hurting and are in need of the TRUTH.


He has been married to his wife Leslie for 31 years and she is a preschool teacher. They have two adult daughters and three grandchildren.
